With its attractive backdrop of the Thames near Pangbourne, Beale Park offers plenty of opportunity for visitors to enjoy the scenery in the beautifully landscaped gardens, trails and lakes. Most paths are tarmacked and on level ground. The wildlife park and gardens are home to over 20 species of animals including deer, lemurs, monkeys and meerkats, plus a wide variety of bird species. Included in your park ticket is a ride on the narrow gauge railway and entrance to the nostalgic 'Treasured Toys' exhibition, which is sure to feature some old favourites from the 50s, 60s and 70s. 
